Dear Advanced Placement Parent/Guardian:

I am writing to you regarding your son or daughter's participation in one of Ware Junior Senior High School's Advanced Placement (AP) courses. As may already know, the AP Program is governed by The College Board, and if you have not already done so, I encourage you to learn more about the AP Program by visiting https://apstudent.collegeboard.org/home. Please review the information contained on the College Board website to learn more about your student's Advanced Placement experience. In addition, please see the Bulletin for AP Students and Parents included with this letter.

Along with other pertinent information, the website and *Bulletin* contain an explanation of the upcoming test cycle's exam fees. The fee for each exam, determined by the College Board, is \$93, with a reduced fee for students who demonstrate financial need. In order to make the exam accessible to all students, Ware Junior Senior High School will cover the cost of this year's exams. As a result, it is our expectation that all students will take the AP exams in the spring. The testing dates are as follows:

May 2nd - AP Physics May 8th - AP Biology

May 10th – AP English Language and Composition

May 11th – AP Statistics
