## Calculating Grade Point Average (GPA)

Each letter grade has numerical Quality Point (QP) number associated with the letter grade (see chart below). You take the QP number and multiply it by the number of credit(s) earned in a class to get your Quality Point Average (QPA) for that specific class. After doing this each class, you add up all of QPA points. Next add up the total number of credits attempted for all of your classes (you must include classes that you did not pass/earn credit in). Once you have this number, you then take the total number of QP's and divide that by the total number of credits attempted. That final number is your grade point average.
