Residency:	All applicants must be a graduating senior of the class of 2024 from Ware Junior/Senior High School and a resident of Ware, Massachusetts.					
Academics:	All applicants must have a minimum 3.0 GPA and must demonstrate a strong academic standing and financial need. Additionally, volunteer performance in the community, participation in school activities, athletics and other activities are taken into consideration. Please be descriptive in your application.					
College:	All applicants must be entering into a degree program at an accredited college, university or technical school during the year 2024. Applicants may be full-time or part-time students with a minimum of 6 credit hours per semester.

Availability:	Applications must be obtained through your high school's guidance department and/or scholarship application depository.					
Application Submission:	Your application must consist of <u>all</u> of the following components: (1) A completed 2024 Scholarship Application containing your detailed and legible responses; and the signatures of the applicant, the applicant's parent and/or guardian, and your Guidance Department; (2) a copy of the student's most recent reporting period high school transcript through March 2024 [NOTE: Transcripts that do not include a senior year grading period will be disqualified]; and (3) Two signed letters of recommendation.

Application Deadline:	Applicants must submit their completed application directly to their School's Guidance Department prior to April 1, 2024. What do our Judges Consider when Reviewing Scholarship Candidates?

It's not an easy job being a scholarship judge. Deciding who will receive an award is a tough decision. By knowing what's on the minds of our scholarship judges, you'll have a better chance at being selected.

>< The First Cut – Eligibility and School Guidance Review

Before your application reaches our judges, it is reviewed by your high school guidance department to ensure you meet our Foundation's eligibility requirements. Your high school is allowed to send us just *five (5)* qualified applications! Many applications don't get past this quick but important first stage. Give your application one last review to be sure yours makes it through.

- Do you pass our Residency, Academics and College Requirements?
- & Is your application neat and legible? An application with coffee stains or messy handwriting won't make the cut.
- Are all of the required documents included? Be sure you're not leaving out important references and your high school transcripts.
- Are all of the questions answered? Scan your application to see if you've left anything out.

★ The Second Cut – Why Pick Me? Selling Yourself to Our Judges!

You've made it through the first cut and are on to the review of our judges. Our judges will then separate the "OKs" from "GREATs!" The applications that make it through are those that have thorough and well-thought-out responses. Make sure your responses are complete and answer the question. It's very important that your grammar and spelling are correct.

Our application provides you with an opportunity to tell your story. Have you been descriptive and thorough in your answers? What will our judges learn about you from your activities and your career goals that makes you stand out from the other applicants? Ask yourself, "Why Pick Me?"

☑ The Final Decision – Your Achievements and Personal Story Were Compelling!

This is the most difficult part of the process for our judges. They've now narrowed the field down to a few highly qualified students. Now they must examine and compare every detail of the application.

- ★ Academics—It's important to have a competitive GPA. However, we also consider how challenging your course load was and take into consideration how involved you were in other school/community activities.
- Leadership—Our judges will examine all your activities and your leadership positions.
- Service—We'll also examine your volunteer efforts. How involved you were and how often. Did you go above and beyond the required service job.
- **← Creativity**—You can show your creative side if you play an instrument, write stories, are involved in the arts. Demonstrate your ability by letting the judges know if you've won any awards.
- **Special circumstances**—If you've overcome any obstacles to achieve your goals, let our judges know, if you're comfortable sharing. Let them know how you achieved all that you've done, in spite of the roadblocks you've encountered.
- Financial Need—Our judges will take into consideration your and/or your guardian's ability to pay for college expenses.
